**It is getting colder in the mornings, please have your child dress accordingly.**

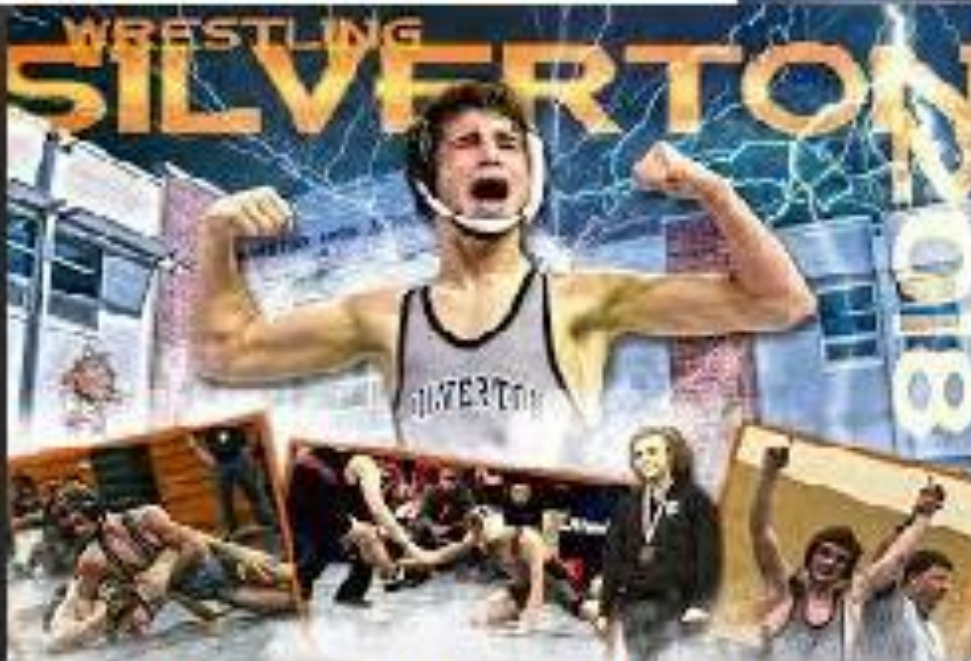
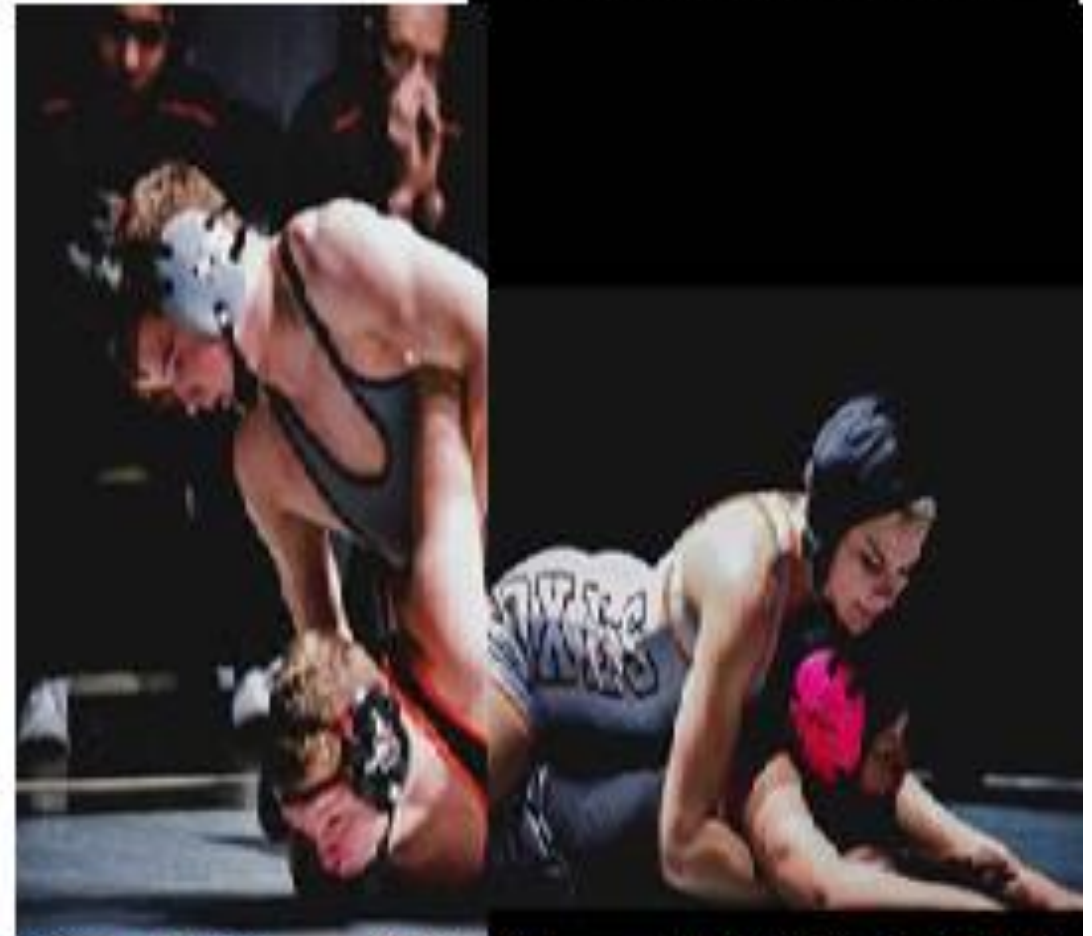


## Silverton Youth Wrestling Clinic Ages: Kindergarten-8th Grade

- **Who:** Boys and girls ages Kindergarten-8th grade living in the Silverton or Mt Angel School District.
- **Why:** To introduce the great sport of wrestling to the youth of our community, and also to begin/promote our youth wrestling season. You have the option of registering for our youth wrestling season at any time during the clinic.
- **Where:** The Silverton High School Wrestling Room.
- **When:** October 21st - 24th, from 6:30-7:30 pm
- **What to bring:** A clean pair of shorts and shirt (preferably without pockets/zippers), wrestling shoes (you can wrestle in socks if you do not have wrestling shoes), water bottle, and a positive attitude.

## **Dress Code at Butte Creek School**

(2019-20)

Butte Creek School is proud of our students and their continual efforts at selecting dress attire that is appropriate for the school setting. Through our dress code, we hope to promote appropriate grooming and hygiene as well as prevent disruption and avoid safety hazards. Appropriate appearance should follow acceptable contemporary fashion and should reflect positively on the individual student, his/her family, and the school. The basic criteria should always be in good taste. Dress that would interfere with the educational process, cause distractions, and/or create safety hazards will not be allowed. The following are examples of the dress code at Butte Creek:

1. We don't allow clothing with words, pictures or logos for alcohol, tobacco products, drugs, vulgarity, violence, bigotry or sexual connotations or those containing double meanings about the above listed items.
2. Pants should fit at the waist, with no underwear showing. Pants should only be about one inch larger than the student's waist. Oversized "saggy" pants which prevent students from safely using stairs and exiting the building quickly during an emergency create a safety hazard. If a belt is worn, it must be worn through all belt loops and not hanging below the waist. **Pants should be in good repair with no see-through distressing or holes above the knees.**
3. We don't allow chains attached to belts, wallets or belt loops.
4. **Shorts and skirts need to cover past mid-thigh length, regardless of what is worn underneath them.** Shorts and skirts should be in good repair with no holes or see through distressing.
5. Crop tops (or any top that shows a bare midriff), spaghetti straps, halter tops, tank tops, or tops with overly large armholes or low-cut necklines are not school-appropriate.
6. Properly worn hats, hoods, and sunglasses are permitted on the playground, but not in the building.
7. We don't allow clothing or symbols that promote or identify gang membership (the wearing of one specific color, such as red, blue, etc; coats or hats that have gang names, style of writing and/or street names displayed on them, no bandannas, no do-rags or hairnets). *The rules for personal attire will be interpreted with enough flexibility to address the issue of gang related content as those symbols change.*

Students participating in elective and extracurricular activities will be expected to follow standards of conduct, dress, and grooming established by their advisors or coaches. At Butte Creek School we strive to maintain a safe school environment that is conducive to learning. The student dress code helps us do that. Thank you in advance for your support.

Dear Butte Creek Parents and Students:

With Halloween coming up soon, we want to share the following with you should you choose to dress up in costume at school. While we want to encourage our students to enjoy and celebrate Halloween, please keep in mind that school safety and learning are still the primary concerns of our school. The following guidelines will assist students in choosing costumes that allow us to have a productive learning environment while enjoying a fun and safe day.

- The Bobcat dress code enforced – *for your reference, on the backside of this letter is a copy of Butte Creek's dress code.*
- Please leave all “weapons” (toy guns, knives, bats, etc.) and dangerous props at home.
- You must be able to sit, walk, breathe, see and hear! (please, no masks that cover the face)
- All accessories must go with your costume. Stand-alone accessories are not considered a costume.
- One costume per student 😊 No switching costumes or props.

**These items are in no way a complete list.** They serve only as a guideline. School staff will be the final judge on the appropriateness of any costume. Any costume deemed inappropriate or too distracting will result in the student having to change. If a student has a question about his or her costume, they are welcome to check in with the office prior to Halloween.
